INTERVIEW QUESTIONS FOR OUR MOMS

What was most shocking or surprising to you about conversation 3?

Is it necessary to have a new and updated sex talk with our daughters?

Will these sessions better equip you to handle the sex talk when it does come?

Have you taken the time to brag on marriage and motherhood in front of your daughter?

Has your daughter expressed excitement over some day getting married and having children?

With all the media accounts of “girls gone wild,” have you been able to take advantage of teachable moments with your daughter?

How are you helping your daughter store up God’s treasure in her heart?
What one takeaway or message of hope did you receive from the study?
