

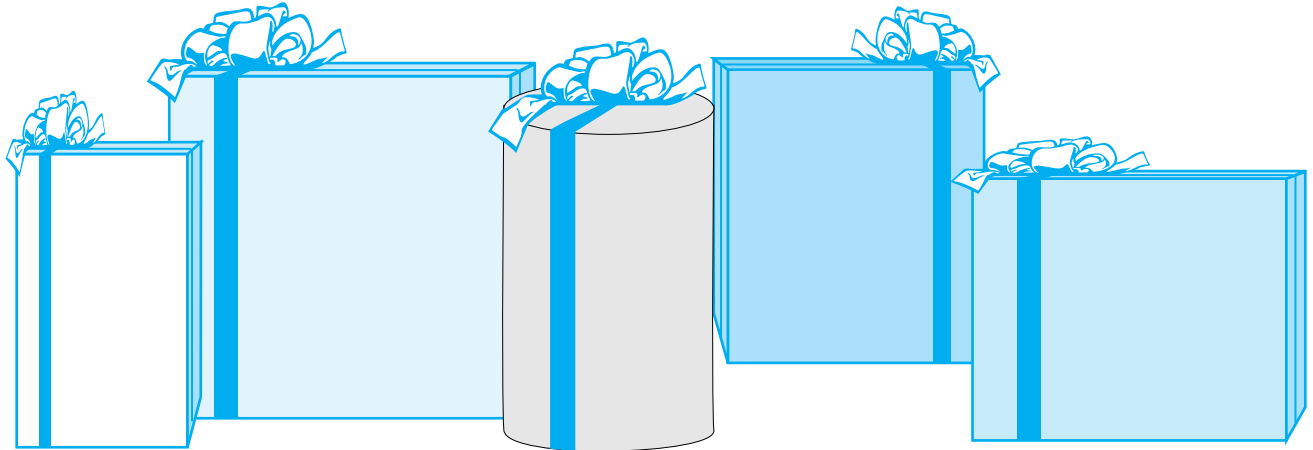

Talented David (1 Samuel 16:14-23; 17:1-51)

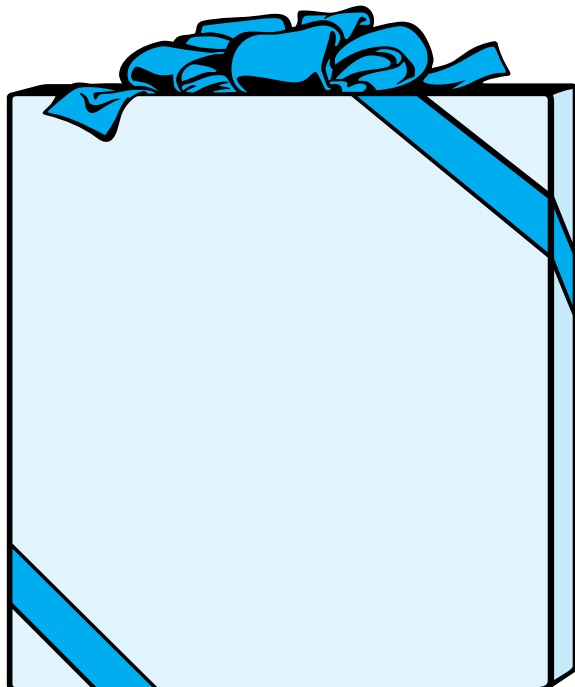
Gifts from God
